

This programme will provide the skills and knowledge to understand and apply sustainability practices to coastal and freshwater bodies based on mātauranga Māori within local environments.

Programme Overview

Wai Ora looks at marine and freshwater science and conservation and how to manage our water resources.

Graduates will gain the skills and knowledge to care for, develop, sustain, enhance and manage their own environment for the benefit of marae, whānau, hapū and iwi to support and guide current and future generations.

Graduates of this qualification will be able to:

- Identify the whakapapa of bodies of water surrounding marae and other Māori communities throughout Aotearoa

- Develop strategies to protect and manage freshwater and marine ecosystems in accordance with mātauranga Māori, contemporary theories and practices to sustain freshwater and marine ecosystems for future generations
- Identify the rights, interests and responsibilities of marae, hapū and iwi regarding freshwater and marine bodies of water

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Entry Requirements

Entry is open to applicants who meet the following requirements:

Minimum age: 17 years

Additional requirements:

Must be a domestic applicant (NZ Citizen or holder of a residence class visa)

How will I study?

There are three types of delivery modes in which this programme may be offered:

- Face to Face Delivery
- Blended Delivery
- Online Delivery

Depending on delivery mode, study may comprise of noho, wānanga, tutorials, lectures, video conferencing and online learning.

Please note: Onsite classes/noho will be pending COVID-19 requirements.

Cultural Pathways

This qualification provides a pathway for graduates to support the development of whānau, hapū and iwi capability and capacity to preserve, nurture an enrich freshwater and marine knowledge for current and future generations. Contribution to community and cultural roles may include involvement as the following:

- Advisors and knowledge holders for marae, whānau, hapū, iwi and hāpori pertaining to freshwater and marine bodies including the concepts, philosophies, kawa/tikanga, and aspirations of mana whenua.
- Whānau, hapū iwi and hāpori liaison/advisory environmental roles for local government, environmental, conservation, and community organisations

Employment Pathways

Graduates will have skills and knowledge for entry level employment roles under limited supervision, which may include:

- Marae, hapū, iwi, hāpori adviser
- Advisor for an environmental, conservation or community organisation
- Fisheries observer
- Navy cadet
- Seafood Processing worker
- Support Services Assistance, National Institute for Water Atmospheric Research (NIWA) or the Department of Conservation
- Local, Regional or Unitary Council Positions
- Te Ohu Kaimoana Roles
- Deep sea fishing crew and factory staff
- Water treatment plant positions

Course Outline

WAI301 Waiora-ā-Tāne

Course Type

Description

In this kōwae ako, tauira will learn the importance of whakapapa, relationships, and geographical boundaries. They will also learn about the importance of a body of water to whānau, hapū, iwi or community.

WAI303 Waimatua

In this kōwae ako, tauira apply mātauranga Māori to sustain ecosystems surrounding water including gathering kai. They will also look at how contemporary theories and practices can be applied to ecosystems surrounding water.

In this kōwae ako, tauira will develop broad strategies to protect and manage freshwater and marine ecosystems in accordance with mātauranga Māori from a whānau, hapū, iwi lens.

In this kōwae ako tauira will identify the rights, interests and responsibilities of whānau, hapū and iwi regarding bodies of water.
